My great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, was the fourth of ten known children born to Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter. Maren was born in Ølsted Sogn, Frederiksborg Amt in Northern Sjaelland in 1837, although her family soon moved a few miles to Bendstrup, Alsønderup Sogn. I believe that all of Maren's siblings remained in Denmark.

In this chapter I summarize my knowledge of:

- Maren Larsen's older relatives, including where they lived in Denmark.
- the older descendants of Maren Larsen and her first husband, Anders Larsen, who immigrated to Iowa with their children in 1870.

Anders Larsen and their youngest child soon died in Council Bluffs.

Maren Larsen then married a widower, Niels Christensen, an immigrant from the Aalborg area, and Niels began to use the Larsen surname. Niels and Maren Larsen had three children, one being Andrew, my maternal grandfather.



Some basic information:

The map on the following page shows the area in northern Sjælland where Maren Larsen's grandparents and parents lived. Maren, Maren's parents, and Maren's paternal grandparents were all born in Ølsted (NW corner) but Maren's parents moved to Bendstrup (the "7" on the "267" in the NE corner) when Maren was a toddler.

I believe that all ten children of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter lived in the area shown on this map except for Maren, who emigrated in 1870, and Birthe Kirstine, who settled with her husband east of Hillerød.




Maren Larsen's Family Sites in northern Sjælland, Denmark - Index Map



Maren Larsen's Paternal Aunts & Uncles - Summary

As the chart on the preceding page shows, Maren's father, Lars Hansen, came from a large family in Frederiksborg Amt north of Copenhagen. Lars and his eight (possibly nine) siblings were all born in the town of Ølsted, in Ølsted Sogn.

Herein I briefly discuss each of Lars Hansen's siblings.

- **Søren Hansen** likely died in childhood. The 1801 census is the only source I have for seen for Søren; another census did not occur until 1834.
- Maren Hansdatter's first husband, Jens Andersen, lived his entire life in Store Lyngby east of Ølsted. Jens died after several years, leaving Maren with two small children. Maren soon married Peder Nielsen, a native of Melby Sogn. Maren and Peder had four known children by her second husband and remained in Lillie Lyngby Sogn.
- **Kirsten Hansdatter** married Søren Pedersen, an Ølsted native, and remained in Ølsted Sogn until near her death. She and Søren had four known children.
- Lars Hansen married Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, an Ølsted native. The Lars Hansen left Ølsted Sogn around 1838, moving northeast to Bendstrup. They had ten known children, the first four born in Ølsted and the remaining six in Bendstrup. Their 4th child, Maren, was my great-grandmother.
- **Niels Hansen** married Maren Larsdatter, an Ølsted native. Niels and Maren remained in Ølsted Sogn and had five children.
- Johanne Hansdatter and Jørgen Larsen lived in Græse from 1838 to 1847 and then returned to Ølsted Sogn. Johanna and Jørgen had six known children.
- **Bodil Hansdatter** married Anders Christiansen, a native of Draaby Sogn. Anders had several children by an earlier marriage. Bodil and Anders remained in Ølsted, and Bodil probably did not have children.
- **Birthe Hansdatter**'s early marriage to Lars Pedersen was presumably without issue and he likely died early in 1850, whereupon Birthe soon remarried. Birthe and her second husband, Mads Nielsen, had four known children and were still living in Ølsted in 1901. They both lived into their 80s or beyond and both probably died in Ølsted.
- Ane Hansdatter's husband, Lars Olsen, was a native of Græse Sogn. Ane and Lars lived in several locations: Ude Sundby 1845 & 1850; Strø 1860; Sigerslevøster 1880. Lars Olsen subsequently died in Karlebo. Ane and Lars had ten known children.

Maren Larsen's Parents & Siblings (all remained in Denmark)

Maren Larsen's parents, Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, were both born in Ølsted By, Ølsted Sogn, Frederiksborg Amt. They were born north of Copenhagen and west of Hillerød on the northern part of the island of Sjælland. In the 1834 census, Lars and Ane Kirstine were still living in Ølsted By, where their four oldest children were born.

Around 1838 Lars and Ane Kirstine moved about ten miles northeast to Bendstrup By, Alsønderup Sogn, where their remaining six children were born. Lars Hansen and most of his children made their living from agriculture. Lars and Ane Kirstine remained in Bendstrup to the end of their long lives and apparently their farm passed to a son-in-law and daughter.

In the 1850 census for Alsønderup Sogn, Lars and Ane Kirstine are enumerated in Bendstrup with their seven living children and Lars is listed as Jordbruger og husfader (Mads is not born yet). In the 1860 census Lars and Ane Kirstine are still in Bendstrup By with seven children and Lars listed as Gaardmand, Husfader (Maren has married and moved to a nearby sogn). In neither of these censuses is anyone enumerated in the household other than immediate family, suggesting that Lars was a small farmer. (The 1855 and 1870 censuses for Alsønderup are not available as of February 2016.)

It appears that by 1880 Lars and Ane Kirstine were living with their son-in-law and daughter, Hans Olsen and Karen Larsen, who perhaps had taken over the Lars Hansen farm.

As the family chart on the next two pages shows, eight of the ten children of Lars and Ane Kirstine lived to maturity and seven married (my great-grandmother, Maren, married twice). All except Maren remained in northern Sjælland.

Later in this section you will find Maren's nieces and nephews included within brief reports on the families of each of the seven children who married.

First here is some information on Ane Marie, who never married.

Ane Marie Larsen, the oldest child of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, apparently remained at home with her parents, later lived with a sibling, and never married.

In the 1860 census Ane Marie is living with her parents and younger children in Bendstrup. In 1880 Ane Marie's parents and Ane Marie are living with her brotherin-law and sister, Hans Olsen and Karen Larsen, in Bendstrup. In 1901, with their parents presumably deceased, Ane Marie is still living with Hans and Karen in Bendstrup with the notation "Af lidt formue". Ane Marie is thought to have died in Ullerød, Tjæreby Sogn.

Segue to Maren Larsen's Siblings

The following sections cover each of the seven married children of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter.

These brief sections generally end with a three-generation chart of family members. In these charts, the first box is not Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter but rather the other set of grandparents. The chart format is typically as follows:

- Box 1: the father and mother of the non-Larsen spouse.
- Box 2: the marriage partners.
- The remaining boxes: the children from this marriage, along with spouses when known. These children were first cousins of my grandfather, Andrew A. Larson.
- I may include a great-grandchild of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter if that great-grandchild emigrated, or had descendants who emigrated. Sometimes I will include some siblings of the non-Larsen marriage partner.
- Charts are often too long to fit on one page.

Except for listing within the three-generation charts, Maren Larsen's nieces and nephews are generally not mentioned. I make exceptions when the niece or nephew had descendants who emigrated.

I generated these charts from my *St. Paul's* database. There are sure to be errors and omissions. I would appreciate any help you can provide.

Hans Larsen, the son of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, married Karen Christensen in 1861.

Karen Christensen, sometimes spelled Kristensen, was born in Alsønderup By to Christen Nilausen and Ane Jensdatter. In the 1860 census she was living in Alsønderup By with her parents.

In the 1860 census Hans Larsen was 25 and unmarried and living with his parents in Bendstrup By. I have been unable to find Hans Larsen and Karen Christensen in the 1870 census records for Frederiksborg Amt, which mostly are not yet on-line. In the 1880 and 1890 censuses, Karen Larsen, a widow, is living in Hillerød Købstad Sogn with their two youngest children.

Hans Larsen and Karen Christensen had six known children, with the first three born in Alsønderup Sogn and the final three in Hillerød. Two or three of the children may have died at a young age.

■ Ane Kirstine "Christine" Larsen (1862-1917) was the oldest child of Hans Larsen and Karen Christensen. In the 1880 census Ane Kirstine was living in Frederiksborg Slot Sogn was working in the Frederiksborg hospital.

Christine immigrated to Council Bluffs, Iowa in 1887 with her baby, Christen Larsen on the *SS Geiser*.

About the SS Geiser: In August 1888, the SS Geiser was rammed by the SS *Thingvalla* near Newfoundland and sank in five minutes with the loss of 79 passengers and 26 crewmembers. The *Thingvalla* was the flagship of the Danish Thingvalla Line, and the *Geiser* was also a Thingvalla Line ship.

In 1888, Christine married Christen Ole Christiansen, the half-brother of my paternal grandfather, James P. Christiansen. Christine and Christen Ole remained in Council Bluffs for the remainder of their lives. Young Christen Larsen did not reach adulthood. However, Christen Ole and Christine Christiansen had two children, Arthur and Oscar, who have living descendants. See the *Christiansen* volume of my family history for more information.

■ **Maren Larsen**, the daughter of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, was my great-grandmother. Maren, her first husband, Anders Larsen, and their older descendants are the subject of much of the current chapter, Chapter 7, of the *Larsen* volume of my family history. For more about Anders Larsen's family members, see *Anders Larsen's Roots & Siblings* and the sections that follow it.

Maren Larsen, her second husband, Niels (Christensen) Larsen, and their older descendants are the subject of Chapters 2 through 5 of the *Larsen* volume.

Anders Larsen was born in Jørlunde Sogn, Frederiksborg Amt, the oldest of four children of Lars Andersen and Maren Johansdatter Schiermacher.

Anders and Maren married in 1858. In 1860, the Anders Larsen family was living in Ullerød, Tjæreby Sogn and early in 1870 they were living in Hillerød.

In the summer of 1870 Anders and Maren and their five children immigrated to Council Bluffs, Iowa. Anders and their youngest child soon died. The remaining four children married and had children, but only the older son, Lars Peter Larson, has living descendants.

Jens Larsen, the son of Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, married Ane Kirstine Mortensen.

Ane Kirstine Mortensen was born in Nejede, Alsønderup Sogn to Morten Hansen and Marie Jonasdatter.

Jens Larsen and Ane Kirstine Mortensen lived in Alsønderup Sogn until about 1875, when they moved to Meløse in Lille Lyngby Sogn. Ane Kirstine died between 1885 and 1890, and Jens was still living in Meløse in 1901.

Jens Larsen and Ane Kirstine Mortensen had ten known children.

■ Jens and Ane Kirstine Larsen's oldest child, Hans Morten Larsen, married Anna Oline Nielsen. I have found this family in Harløse By, Tjæreby Sogn in the 1890, 1906 and 1930 censuses.

Hans Morten Larsen and Anna Oline Nielsen had eleven children. The four who are known to have left Denmark for the western hemisphere are listed here and in the chart that follows.

- **Peder Larsen**, enumerated as Lars Peter in the 1890 Denmark census, immigrated to the United States and settled in Havre in north central Montana. Peter served in France during World War I with the 2nd Field Signal Battalion of the 1st Infantry Division. Peter subsequently was a shoe repairman in Havre.
- **Carl Waldemar Larsen** immigrated to the United States and served in France during World War I. Carl lived in the Havre area, where he worked as a plasterer. Carl visited Denmark on at least two occasions. In 1930 he returned from a visit to Denmark with a bride, Johanne.
- Jens Larsen immigrated to Brazil during the period ____. In Brazil he was murdered in a restaurant he operated. Jens has living descendants in Brazil today.
- Agnes Cecelia Larsen came to Havre with her brother, Carl, who was visiting Denmark early in 1923. In Havre Agnes married Casper Nyborg, a widower with two children. Casper Nyborg was an employee of the Northern Pacific Railroad, who eventually was transferred to Washington State, settling in Spokane.

Casper Nyborg's son from his first marriage, Harry, died in New Guinea in the South Pacific during World War II. As of 2016 Casper and Agnes' son, James, is a retired Lutheran minister living in Washington State.

• Jens Larsen immigrated to Argentina between 1915 and 1920. He was murdered in his restaurant. Descendants still live in Argentina.





In all the census records I have seen, Hans Jørgensen was listed as a gaardejer (farm owner).

Hans and Birthe Kirstine may have had ten or eleven children, however Birthe Kirstine was a bit too old to have been the birth mother of the youngest children listed in the census records. I have recorded ten children.

Anders Larsen was my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen's, first husband. Anders and Maren and their five children immigrated to Council Bluffs, Iowa from the Hillerød area in 1870. Anders and their youngest child died soon thereafter. Maren subsequently married Niels Christensen, who then assumed the name of Niels Larsen.


Anders Larsen's older relatives generally lived in several rural parishes southwest of Hillerød. There is considerable information on-line about his maternal relatives. However some of the dates and places are not consistent.

Anders' father died when Anders was fifteen, and Anders' mother then remarried. Charts on the following page show Anders' siblings from both marriages.

Anders shared the name of his paternal grandfather, Anders Larsen. The older Anders was a smallholder in Jørlunde Sogn. Anders' maternal grandfather, Johan Peter Schiermacher, was a blacksmith and farmer.

Anders Larsen was born in Jørlunde Sogn, also the birth and death place of his father and his paternal grandparents. In 1834 Anders was living with his parents and widowed grandmother on the grandparents' small holding.



The Lives of Anders Larsen and Maren Larsen

My great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, was born in Ølsted Sogn, Frederiksborg County, Denmark to Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter.

Maren Larsen and her first husband, Anders Larsen, had five known children as shown below. All were born in Denmark and emigrated with their parents.



Anders Larsen, Maren Larsen's first husband, was born in 1832, the first child of Lars Andersen and Maren Johansdatter. Anders was born in Jørlunde, Frederiksborg Amt, about eight miles southwest of Hillerød. Anders' father was a day laborer who was born in Jørlunde Sogn, while Anders' mother was born in Gørløse Sogn about five miles north of Jørlunde.

When Anders Larsen was a teenager, his father evidently died, and in 1847 his mother married Christen Andersen. Anders soon left home and moved to Nyhuse, a mile west of central Hillerød, in the Frederiksborg Slot Sogn. In the 1850 census, Anders is a hired boy working for Jørgen Pedersen a clog maker (træskomand) in Nyhuse, Frederiksborg Slot Sogn. Anders is thought to have later become a clog maker in Denmark.

Anders Larsen and Maren Larsdatter married in Alsønderup Sogn on October 19, 1858. Their first child was born in 1859. They appear to have lived in or near Hillerød until they emigrated eleven years later.

In the 1860 census, Anders, Maren, and their oldest child, Maren Kirstine, were living in

Ullerød in Tjæreby Sogn. Ullerød is about two miles northwest of central Hillerød.

Of interest: Four of Maren and Anders Larsen's five children were christened in the ornate Frederiksborg Slot chapel in Hillerød. However, their second child, Karen Marie, was christened in Maren's parents' church in Alsønderup in September 1861. Therein lies a story: In December 1859, Countess Danner, the king's consort, was staying in Frederiksborg Slot. Countess Danner was cold and asked that the fireplaces be stoked up. The unfortunate result was a fire that destroyed the palace interior and damaged the chapel. So, since the chapel was being rebuilt, Karen Marie had to be christened elsewhere.

On May 13, 1870, Anders Larsen completed a Copenhagen police emigration form. Anders, my great-grandmother, Maren, and their children were living in Hillerød at that time. Anders, Maren, and their five children (Maren Kirstine, Karen Marie, Lars Peter, Lauritz Julius and Emmeline) left Liverpool, England on the **SS** *Colorado* and landed in New York on May 31.

The SS Colorado was built in 1867 in England. It was built of iron with a screw propeller and two masts rigged for sail. It has a capacity of about 900 passengers, mostly in third (steerage) class. My Internet source says the Colorado was rated at 10 knots – I believe that is too slow. On February 7, 1872, it sailed from Liverpool bound for New York. It collided with the SS Arabian in the Mersey channel near Liverpool and sank with the loss of six lives.

In the August 1870 United States census, Anders, Maren, and their children were living in Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie County, Iowa, with Anders' listed as a laborer. Sadly, not long later Anders Larsen and his youngest child, Emmeline, both died.

■ Emmeline Larsen, the youngest child of my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, and her first husband, Anders Larsen, was born in 1869, and died as a toddler after the family immigrated to Council Bluffs in 1870. I don't know where Emmeline is buried.

Subsequently Maren Larsen married my great-grandfather, Niels (Christensen) Larsen, by whom she had three children, Annie, Andrew and Henry.


Henry Linsel and Maren Kirstine "Christine" Larsen Family

Christine Larsen, the oldest child of my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, and Maren's first husband, Anders Larsen, was born in Denmark in 1859 as Maren Kirstine, and immigrated with her family to Council Bluffs in 1870.

In 1878 Christine married Henry Linsel Jr., the son of Henry Linsel of Council Bluffs.

About the Linsel Family:



In 1879, when Christine's only child, Minnie May, was born, Henry and Christine Linsel may have been living in Red Oak, Iowa. In 1880, the Henry Linsel family was living in Forest City, Holt Co., Missouri, where Henry was a butcher.

As shown on the following chart, Henry and Christine Linsel had one child, Minnie, and one grandchild, Raymond, but no great-grandchildren.



In the 1880s Christine (Larsen) Linsel and her husband, Henry Linsel, vanish from my history. The last record I have of Christine is her entry in the 1880 Missouri census. The last record I have of Henry is his appearance at the Bartel's grocery store in the early 1880s as related below.

I don't know where Christine or her husband, Henry Linsel, are buried. George Appel, Minnie's first husband, is buried in St. Joseph Cemetery in Council Bluffs. Minnie, her second husband, Arthur Gibson, and Minnie's son, Raymond Appel, are buried in Kalispell, Montana.

I have never seen a photograph of Christine, and the one known photograph of Minnie is lost.

My great-grandparents, Niels and Maren Larsen, had a hair wreath, a decorative wall hanging made from Christine's hair. This hair wreath was passed to their daughter-in-law, Ellen (Hansen) Larson, and then to their granddaughter, Ethel (Larson) Torneten. When Aunt Ethel's household was broken up in 2012, I took this hair wreath to the Museum of Danish America in Elk Horn, Iowa who accepted it into their collection.

• **Minnie May Linsel**, the daughter of Christine (Larsen) Linsel, was my mother's oldest cousin. Matt and Mary (Grote) Bartel, grocers in Council Bluffs took in Minnie when she was a small child and subsequently raised her.

The Bartel's grandson, George Arthur Bartel Jr., in his family history *In Those Days*, poignantly tells how Minnie Linsel came to live with the Bartels:

"In addition to raising their grand-daughter Dorothy, my grandparents raised a little girl, Midge (sic). Midge's father came into Grandpa's store one day and told him he had to go to Denver because he had been offered a job. He needed someone to watch his little girl for a few days. My grandparents didn't know him, but they agreed. The man never returned. My grandparents never knew if he had an accident or just left his little girl."

In 1897, Minnie married George Appel, the son of Jacob and Caroline (Ritter) Appel of Council Bluffs. George and Minnie Appel soon separated and divorced.

The one child of George and Minnie is listed below.

▲ **Raymond Appel** (1898 – 1924), an artist, died in Chicago at age 26.

In June 1898 Minnie and her baby, Raymond, were living with her grandmother and step grandfather, Maren and Niels Larsen, at their farm home in Hazel Dell Township. A letter written at that time, which Trent Larson provided me, suggests that Minnie's mother was still alive. However, I believe the letter writer thought that Mary Bartel was Minnie's mother.

In 1900, 1902, 1905 and 1910 I found Minnie living in Council Bluffs. She is listed as a dressmaker or as a clerk at the John Beno Company.

Minnie (Linsel) Appel married Arthur V. Gibson and left Council Bluffs between 1910 and 1915.

Arthur Vane Gibson was born in Illinois and worked as a carpenter in mining country in Montana before going into the hotel and apartment business. He had two daughters by his first marriage, to Orpha Ann Fuson.

Of interest: Orpha Ann (Fuson) Gibson was listed as head of household in the 1910 and 1920 censuses. However, in the 1930 census she lists her ex-husband, Arthur Gibson, as head of household.

Arthur, Minnie and Minnie's son, Raymond, were running a hotel in Kalispell,

Montana in 1920.

In the early 1920s Arthur and Minnie Gibson moved to Miami, Florida, where they were living in the 1925, 1930, 1935 and 1940 censuses. Arthur and Minnie owned apartment buildings in Miami.

Minnie (Linsel) Appel Gibson died in Miami in May 1953. Arthur Gibson died in Miami six years earlier.

■ Mary K. Larsen, the daughter of my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, and her first husband, Anders Larsen, was born in Denmark in 1861 and immigrated with her family to Council Bluffs in 1870.


Mary married John T. Henderson, a native of Norway, around 1882. John and Mary Henderson lived in Council Bluffs.

Initially John T. Henderson was a piano tuner. From before 1900 to after 1910 he also ran a company that produced novelty items.

The John T. Henderson family lived at 509 Stutsman St. between 1892 and 1910. John and Mary separated between 1910 and 1920, and by 1920 Mary was living at 15 Voorhis St., the same home where their youngest child, Beulah, was living at her death in 1966.

In the 1930 census, John and Mary were evidently separated and Mary was working at the Pottawattamie County home in McClelland.

John T. and Mary Henderson had five daughters, four of whom lived to maturity, and one grandchild, but no great-grandchildren.



John T. and Mary K. Henderson and three of their daughters, Vadie, Erna and Beulah, are interred in Fairview Cemetery in Council Bluffs. Bessie and both of her husbands are interred in Forest Lawn Cemetery in Omaha. I don't know where Lelia is interred.

• **Bess E. Henderson** lived in Omaha and had no children. Bess and her first husband, Webster Dennis, lived at 5009 Lafayette Avenue with Webster's

widowed mother. Webster worked for the Orchard and Wilhelm wholesale furniture company, and Bess was a stenographer. After Webster died, Bess married Jim Downs who had lived in Missouri at one time.

• Vadie Kristine Henderson married Clifford Augustus Pumroy, the son of William Joseph Pumroy and Emma Fillman of Corning, Iowa.

Clifford Pumroy was a photographer.

Clifford and Vadie Pumroy had no children and divorced in the early or mid 1920s.

Vadie Pumroy was living in Council Bluffs in 1929, 1934 and 1940 and was living at 15 Voorhis St. at the time of her death.

Clifford Pumroy moved to Little Rock, Arkansas, and married Elizabeth Catheleen Parker in 1926.

• Lelia Henderson married William Jardine, a Council Bluffs resident.

Lelia and William Jardine lived in Council Bluffs, in Nebraska, and in Casper, Wyoming.

I have no information about William Jardine after 1920. Lelia (Henderson) Jardine was living in Council Bluffs in 1925, 1934 and 1956.

William and Lelia Jardine had one known child:

- ▲ **Marie K. Jardine** was born in Nebraska and died of measles as a toddler.
- **Beulah Henderson** remained in Council Bluffs, and never married. Beulah worked as a secretary, and lived at 15 Voorhis St. until her death.

■ Lars Peter "Pete" Larson, the son of my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, and her first husband, Anders Larsen, was born in Denmark in 1865 and immigrated with his family to Council Bluffs in 1870.


Lars Peter Larson married Clara J. Smith in 1889.

About Clara Smith: Clara Smith was the daughter of Albert Benjamin Smith and Emma Elizabeth Wright, early settlers in southern Boomer Township north of Council Bluffs. The Smith family belonged to the RLDS church, and Smith family members founded and ran the Boomer Store.

Pete and Clara Larson farmed in south central Boomer Township. By 1894 Pete had acquired the 120-acre Powell home place in Section 27 and by 1913 he owned an additional farm, which may have been the Mackland home place, in Section 34.

Between 1920 and 1925, Pete and Clara's son, Floyd, took over the home place, and Pete and Clara moved to the Downsville area in southwestern Norwalk Township, south of Underwood and east of Weston. Portions of this farm remained in the Larson family until around 2004.

The six children of Lars Peter and Clara Larson are listed below. Grandchildren are listed on subsequent pages.



As of 2011, all of Lars Peter and Clara Larson's twelve grandchildren are deceased, except for Violet's daughter, Joyce.

Lars Peter and Clara Larson are interred in the Grange Cemetery in Boomer Township, as is their son, Lee. Their remaining children are interred in the Cedar Lawn and Memorial Park cemeteries in Council Bluffs.

Clora Dutrow was the only surviving child of William Henry "Billy" Dutrow and Lulu Luemma Meneray who were both born near Crescent, Iowa, north of Council Bluffs.

Clora Dutrow grew up on the Dutrow home place about two miles north and west of Crescent. Her father was a farmer, then a horse dealer and, after moving to Council Bluffs before 1920, an auctioneer.

After Charles and Clora married, Charles ran a hardware store in Underwood, Iowa. Between 1920 and 1925, Charles and Clora moved to Council Bluffs where they lived the remainder of their lives. For many years, they lived at 3427 Avenue F. Clora's mother lived with Charles and Clora for the last years of her life.

During his years in Council Bluffs, Charles pursued a number of occupations. He was listed as a commercial traveler in 1929 and 1930; he was running a service station in 1939; he was a salesman in 1946.

Charles and Clora Larson are interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery in Council Bluffs.

The two children of Charles and Clora Larson are listed below.



▲ **Raymond Larson** was a World War II veteran, serving in the 11th Armored Division in Western Europe. The 11th Armored Division first saw combat in the Bastogne area late in 1944 in the Battle of the Bulge (Source: 11tharmoreddivision.com).

After World War II, Raymond married Lora Ellen Spellmeyer, who had four children from her previous marriage to Sylvester Jones. One of these children, Gary Lee Jones (2 Oct 1936 – 25 Jul 1995), is deceased.

Raymond and Lora had one child and subsequently divorced.

Raymond Larson lived in Council Bluffs.

Raymond Larson is interred in Memorial Park Cemetery in Council Bluffs. Lora (Spellmeyer) Jones Larson Jessen is interred in Macedonia Cemetery in Macedonia, Iowa.

▲ Lyle Larson married Alta Leytham, the youngest child of Jesse Leytham and Elsie O'Neill who were born in the Neola, Iowa area. Jessie and Elsie farmed

in Buffalo County, Nebraska, and lived in the Neola area before moving to Council Bluffs in the 1920s.

Lyle and Alta Larson lived in Council Bluffs and did not have children.

Lyle and Alta Larson are interred in Memorial Park Cemetery in Council Bluffs.

• Louis Julius Larson, the son of Lars Peter Larson and Clara Smith, married Marjorie Vea Baker, who was born in Ida Grove, Iowa, to Frederick Baker and Cordelia Didama Cooley.

Louis and Marjorie Larson lived in the Council Bluffs area except for a few years in Logan, Harrison County, Iowa.

Louis and Marjorie Larson, along with three of their children, are interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery in Council Bluffs.

The seven children of Louis and Marjorie Larson are listed below.

Of the children and sons-in-law of Louis and Marjorie, the following are known to have served in World War II: Charley Kennedy, Arthur Wilson, and Robert Larson.

▲ **Mildred Larson** marred Charley Kennedy, who was born in Lincoln, Nebraska. Charley and Mildred Kennedy lived in Burlington, Iowa.

Charley and Mildred Kennedy had three children, including the late Charles Robert Kennedy (10 Mar 1944 – 13 May 1984).

Charley and Mildred Kennedy are interred in Aspen Grove Cemetery in Burlington.

▲ **Ione Evelyn Larson** married Arthur Wilson, the son of Guy and Ethel (Poole) Wilson of Council Bluffs.

Arthur and Ione had two children and divorced.

Subsequently Ione married Earl Haferbier who was born in Logan, Iowa, to John and Nellie (Plummer) Haferbier.

By 1977 Ione Haferbier owned portions of the former Lars Peter Larson farm in southwestern Norwalk Township. Earl and Ione Haferbier lived on this farm for a number of years in the late 20th century.

Arthur and Ione Wilson were the parents of Craig Wilson of Council Bluffs, co-organizer of the 2000 Larsen/Larson reunion.

Ione and her second husband, Earl Haferbier, are interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery in Council Bluffs.

▲ **Daryle Larson** married Blanche Hughes, who was born in Blackfoot, Idaho. Daryle and Blanche settled in Zion, Illinois, north of Chicago after World War II.

Daryle and Blanche Larson and had four children, including the late Lloyd Larson (4 Dec 1942 – 13 Apr 2002), co-organizer of the 2000 Larsen/Larson reunion.

Daryle Larson is interred in Frederick Memorial Cemetery in Frederick, Oklahoma. Blanche had a second marriage, to a Mr. Banks, and died in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Blanche is interred in Beach Park, Illinois, near Zion.

▲ **Opal Maxine "Maxine" Larson** remained in the Omaha/Council Bluffs area and never married.

Maxine Larson is interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery.

▲ **Robert Louis Larson** married Rudean Salmon, a native of Jacksonville, Florida, while serving in the navy during World War II.

Robert and Rudean Larson settled in Baltimore, Maryland. Robert and Rudean had two children.

Rudean (Salmon) Larson collected data on the Larson family genealogy. Later Rudean's nephew, Lloyd Larson, continued her research.

After Rudean's death, Robert married Elaine Ramey, a native of Virginia.

Robert and Rudean Larson are interred in Bel Air Memorial Gardens in Harford County, Maryland, northeast of Baltimore.

▲ **Ilsa Mae Larson** lived in Council Bluffs during her first marriage, and subsequently lived in Omaha.

Ilsa had three children by her first husband, two by her second, and one by her third.

Ilsa and her third husband, William Volenec, are interred in Cavalry Cemetery in Omaha.

▲ **Phyllis Larson** married Richard Ingraham, who was born in Council Bluffs to Clarence and Edna (Miller) Ingraham.

Richard and Phyllis Ingraham remained in Council Bluffs for most of their married life, except for Richard's service in the army during the Korean War.

Richard and Phyllis Ingraham had three children.

Richard and Phyllis Ingraham are interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery.

• Floyd Larson, the son of Lars Peter Larson and Clara Smith, married Irene Anderson. Irene was born in Omaha to John and Hazel Anderson, who were living in Griswold, Iowa, in 1920.

Floyd Larson farmed his parents' home place in Boomer Township.

Floyd and Irene Larson are interred in Memorial Park Cemetery in Council Bluffs.

The one child of Floyd and Irene Larson is listed below.



▲ **Donna Lee Larson** married Junior Marion Rasmussen, a Boomer Township neighbor who was my father's first cousin. Junior and Donna Lee had no children and divorced in 1954.

After divorcing Junior Rasmussen, Donna Lee resumed using the surname of "Larson". Donna Lee subsequently had one child, a daughter. As of 2011, Donna Lee Larson was living in Council Bluffs.

• Lee Jefferson Larson, the youngest son of Lars Peter Larson and Clara Smith, was born in 1900 and grew up with his other siblings on his parents' home place in Boomer Township west and north of St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

In the 1920s Lee left his parents' home and moved nearby to his father's other Boomer Township farm, the old Mackland place near the Boomer #8 school.

Lee farmed and drove a truck in Boomer Township.

Lee Larson moving to southern Oregon or extreme northern California around 1938, and died in Siskiyou County, California, in 1968.

Lee Larson never married.

Lee Larson is interred in the Grange Cemetery in Boomer Township.

▲ **Joyce Clara Nielsen** graduated from Underwood High School in 1945 and moved to California a few years later.

Harry and Joyce Lundberg had two children before divorcing. Their younger child, Mary Ann (12 Jan 1952 – 3 Apr 2000), is deceased.

As of January 2016, Joyce Webb was living in Ventura, California.


• Mabel Larson, the youngest child of Lars Peter Larson and Clara Smith, married Alfred Andreas "Pete" Hoeppner. Pete Hoeppner was the son of Herman Hoeppner and Minnie C. Bruene and was raised in Pleasant Township, Pottawattamie County, Iowa, between Minden and Avoca.

Pete and Mabel Hoeppner farmed five miles northeast of Neola between Neola and Minden until they had a farm sale in 1944. In 1945 they bought a house in Neola and in August 1946 they divorced.

After divorcing, Mabel lived with her father until his death in 1949 and later lived in a house owned by Pete. By 1952 Pete was living in Council Bluffs, where for a time he kept the Oaks Tavern at 212 West Broadway. Mabel eventually moved to Springfield, Missouri, to be near her son.

Mabel (Larson) Hoeppner is interred in Cedar Lawn Cemetery in Council Bluffs. I don't know where Pete Hoeppner is interred.

The one child of Pete and Mabel Hoeppner is listed below.



▲ **Delmar Hoeppner** was a World War II veteran. He worked for an oil company and was transferred to Missouri. He died in an automobile accident in southern Missouri.

Delmar and Avanelle Hoeppner had two children.

Delmar Hoeppner is interred in the Springfield National Cemetery in Springfield, Missouri.

Lauritz Julius "Louis" Larsen and Karen Laurette "Carrie" Beck Family

■ Louis Julius Larsen, the son of my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen, and her first husband, Anders Larsen, was born in Denmark in 1867 as Lauritz Julius and emigrated from the Hillerød area of Denmark to Council Bluffs with his parents and siblings in 1870.

Louis Julius Larsen left Pottawattamie County and moved to Racine, Wisconsin in the late 1890s. Louis married Carrie Beck in 1901.

About Carrie Beck and her parents: Karen Laurette "Carrie" Beck was born in Sønder Galten Sogn, near Aarhus, Denmark, one of eleven children of Thomas Christian Beck and Bodil Marie Caspersen.

Carrie and both of her parents were born in the middle part of the peninsula of Jutland.

Thomas Christian Beck (22 Apr 1841 - 1 Sep 1923) was born in Gammel Rye Sogn, Skanderborg Amt to Chresten Nielsen and Jensine Rasmusdatter. His wife to be, Bodil Marie Caspersen (14 Oct 1845 - 27 Apr 1927) was born in Galten Sogn, Aarhus Amt to Casper Nielsen and Karen Nielsdatter.

Galten is about 15 miles west of Aarhus and Gammel Ry and Rye are about 8 miles west of Skanderborg. Although Galten and Ry are in different counties they are only about 10 miles apart.

As a child, Thomas Christian Beck was named Thomas Chrestensen. When he married Bodil in Sønder Galten, Aarhus Amt on 2 Nov 1866, his name was recorded as Thomas Christensen.

The Christensen/Beck family immigrated in 1890. In the 1900 census Thomas and Bodil Marie are living northwest of Milwaukee in the Erin/Monches area in southwest Washington County.

Louis and Carrie Larsen: Louis Julius Larsen and Karen Laurette "Carrie" Beck married at her parents' home in Monches in 1901.


Louis Larsen was a clerk in a retail shoe store in Racine, Wisconsin. He and Carrie lived at 1604 Grange Avenue from before 1910 for the remainder of their married lives. Carrie's parents lived with them until their deaths.

Louis and Carrie Larsen had one child, two grandchildren, but no greatgrandchildren.

• Louis and Carrie Larsen's daughter, Esther, married George W. Reed, the son of Hiram Reed and Ida Jakeway and a native of Ohio. George Reed was a machinist who worked in the auto industry.

George and Esther Reed lived in Wisconsin. They were living in Racine in 1930 and in Kenosha in 1935. In 1940 they were living with Louis at 1604 Grange Avenue, and they and their two sons were still living in this house in 1960.

The known descendants of Louis and Carrie Larsen are listed below.



Louis and Carrie Larsen are interred at the Mound Cemetery in Racine. Currently I don't know where Esther and her sons are buried.

There are no living descendants.

Chapter 7 - Maren Larsen's Other Relatives - Notes Updated by RAC 27 Feb '16.

A Red Flag

Some years ago, my 3rd cousin, Rev. James Nyborg, acquired a trove of information about our common Larsen ancestors and relatives in Denmark. Late in 2015, Jim kindly passed this information on to me. I am deeply indebted to Jim for this information and for the addition help he provided me in researching my great-grandmother, Maren Larsen's, relatives in Denmark.

My coverage of Maren Larsen's Danish ancestors and relatives is largely drawn from Jim's information and from what I found in myheritage.dk, which also has much coverage on this family. The data Jim provided and the myheritage data contain quite a few differences, especially involving dates.

I have not had, nor will I have the time in the future, to resolve these differences. I do have a partial list of such differences that I would gladly send to any avid Larsen researcher.

The upshot is that one should take details provided herein on my Larsen ancestors and relatives in Denmark, such as dates and places, with a grain of salt.

Major Sources for Chapter 7 - Maren Larsen's Other Relatives

- In the 1990s the late Lloyd Larson, the great-great-grandson of Anders and Maren Larsen worked intensively on the history of the Anders and Maren Larsen family starting from fragmentary charts left behind by older relatives.
- Stamtavle over Efterkommere af Simon Bertelsen og Hustru Karen Simonsdatter paa "Steengaard" i Ølstykke, 1628-1892 by J. Jensen, Copenhagen, 1892 or 1893. I suspect this was a source for the following two bulleted sources. It is available at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City.
- *Pedersen Web Site* in myheritage.dk maintained by Erik Pedersen contains much information on Maren Larsen's older relatives in Denmark.
- For Anders Larsen's roots and siblings, *Hjemmeside om slægten Schiermacher* at schiermacker-jensen.dk. Look at the *Niels søn Johan* page, http://www.schiermacker-jensen.dk/21781043. (Johan Peter Nielsen Schiermacher was Anders Larsen's maternal grandfather.)
- Korttilkirken.dk contains the contemporary parish boundary maps I used, and a wealth of other information. There is no English version.
- Frederiksborg Amt census records for 1860, 1880, 1890 and 1901. Most

Frederiksborg Amt census records for 1870 and for post 1901, except for 1930, are not yet on-line. (See the *Denmark Summary Census Tables - Larsen* section of Chapter 8 - Notes for more information about the Larsen census records I used.)

• My recently-discovered third cousins, Svend Larsen and James Nyborg, provided the motivation for my recent work on this section, and James provided data going back several centuries for one of the family roots.

Chapter 7 - Maren Larsen's Other Relatives - Appendix Tidselholm

Tidselholm is a farm on the southwest edge of the tiny village of Bendstrup, northwest of Hillerød and east of Alsønderup. This farm was once occupied by Maren Larsen's family members.

Careful: There is another farm named Tidselholm on the island of Fyn.

Between 1837 and 1840, when Maren was a small child, her parents, Lars Hansen and Ane Kirstine Jensdatter, moved their young family from Ølsted to Bendstrup. Lars and Ane Kirstine apparently remained in Bendstrup for the remainder of their lives.

However, I don't know if the Lars Hansen initially moved to Tidselholm, as most censuses for Alsønderup Sogn don't give the farm name. Here is what I know:

- A 1993 later to Jim Nyborg, of which I have a copy, alludes to the relationship between the Lars Hansen family and Tidselholm.
- In the 1880 census Maren's parents are living with their son-in-law and daughter, Hans Olsen and Karen Larsen, are living at Tidselholm.
- In the 1906 census Hans Olsen and Karen Larsen are living at Tidselholm.
- Lars Hansen, and Hans Olsen are both listed in myheritage.dk as "Gaardejer paa Tidselholm i Bendstrup".

Tidselholm has a long history, going back at least to 1682.

About the first photograph:

I found this photograph in the Andreas Hansen-Ruth article cited below that features their daughter, Tove. Below is the Danish caption with my English translation.

"Gaarden Tidselholm i Bendstrup fra Luften med udsigt til Arresø, foto fra sidst i 1940eme. Laden til venstre var der ikke, da Tove boede der."

"The Tidselholm farm in Bendstrup from the air looking towards Arresø lake, photo from the 1940s. The barn on the left wasn't there when Tove lived there."

The first reference to Tidselholm I found on-line was on p. 239 of Personalhistorisk Tidsskrift, 1895, by G. L. Grove, which is available through books.google.com. The reference is presumably for a transaction around 1682. The article in question, which begins on p. 206, is entitled Borgerlige Rigsdagmænd fra 1660 (Hans Hansen Akte og Hans Jørgensen Husum) by Frederik Barfod.

In 1923 Andreas Hansen-Ruth and his wife, Gunhild Hjorth, bought Tidselholm (http://lokalarkivet-alsoenderup.dk/wp-content/uploads/2016/02/2008-nr-4-5.pdf Mar 2016). I don't know who they bought it from or when they sold it.
