The *Hansen* volume focuses on my great-grandparents Peter Hansen and Dorthe Hansen, their older descendants, and their older relatives in the United States.

The *Hansen* volume is much shorter than the companion *Larsen* volume because:

- Two of the Hansen children, Karen Margrethe "Maggie" and Ellen Marie "Ellie", married Larsen brothers, Andrew Larson and Henry Larson. Their story is told in the *Larsen* volume.
- Unlike Niels (Christensen) Larsen and Maren Larsen, both Peter and Dorthe Hansen had but one marriage.
- Although Peter and Dorthe left a number of siblings behind in Denmark, I know little about the lives of those siblings.
