Leonard C. Frahm's father was born in north Germany and immigrated to the United States as a young man. He appears to have worked as a farmhand thereafter.

Leonard C. Frahm was born in Lincoln Township, Pottawattamie County, southeast of Avoca. His family lived on farms in the Hancock, Avoca, Walnut, Shelby, and Harlan areas. In 1940, Leonard was a farmhand living with his family in Lincoln Township, Shelby County, west of Harlan.

Leonard C. Frahm entered active duty in August 1940. His 87<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division left the United States in October 1944 and crossed from England to France in November. They participated in the latter stages of the Battle of the Bulge, captured Koblenz in March 1945, and then raced east towards the Czech border, arriving in Plauen, Germany on April 16.
