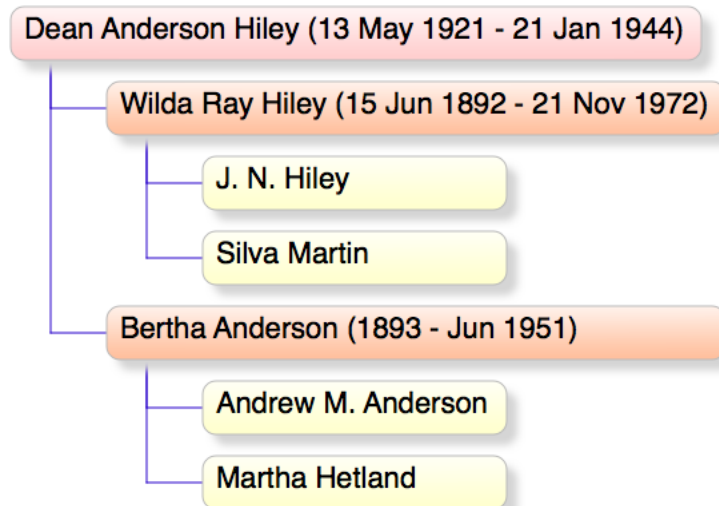

The Hiley family moved to Avoca from Adams County, Iowa in the late 1930s. In April 1940, Dean Hiley was working as a farmhand for his brother-in-law and sister, Willard and Corene Campbell, in Adams County.

Dean Hiley enlisted in the United States Army at Camp Dodge, Iowa in March 1943. He received a Silver Star for gallantry in action during the bloody and abortive forcing of the Rapido River southwest of Cassino.

After World War II, Dean Hiley's parents moved to Glenwood, Iowa, where they are buried. In the 1950s and 1960s, Dean's brother, Arthur, was a feed and produce dealer in Avoca. Arthur and his wife remained in Avoca, where they died.
