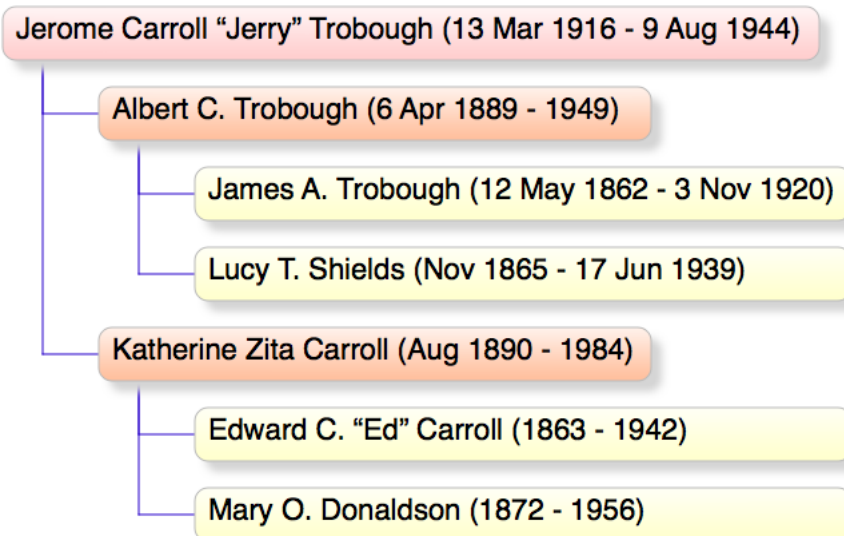

Jerome C. "Jerry" Trobough was born and raised in Avoca, where his father was a bridge carpenter. In the 1930s the family moved to Omaha, where Jerome married while on leave in 1944.

Jerry's B-24 heavy bomber crashed from engine failure into the sea near Momote Airdrome, Admiralty Islands, Southwest Pacific while returning from a bombing mission over Yap in the Caroline Islands.
