- The event resulted in 15 or more American deaths.
- The event resulted in the death of a *Pottawattamie Area WW II Dead Roster* member, indicated by a star (or stars) in the first column.

In addition, I include

- major explosions at port facilities.
- a few ships that lost fewer than 15 US personnel. Such ships are not boldfaced.

About the table:

- This table is largely chronological.
- Ships that survived are noted in the second column.
- For damaged ships which sank later, I include both dates.
- Distances and personnel counts are approximate.
- Sources are provided in Big Pigeon's WWII US > WWII at Sea.
